### **CALL PROCESS**

What is "The Call Process?" What is "The Call?"

When John and I decided to move from Idaho to Alaska 30 years ago we spent a lot of time praying and thinking about how that move would affect our family, our future and our relationship with God. We drove up the AK Hwy interviewed for jobs and came to work in Soldotna. There were many steps along the way and we have many stories about how God directed us not only to Soldotna and our jobs but also our church. You can say that we were "Called" to our life here. In sort of the same way, Pastors in the ELCA are not assigned to a church by the Bishop, and they don't go to various churches asking if there are any positions open that they can interview for, instead a Pastor seeking a change in their congregational ministry accepts a "Call" from another congregation. The ELCA Call Process is a time of thoughtful assessment and prayerful discernment about the ministry and mission of the local church. Each bishop is responsible for the way Call Process is managed within their respective territory.

The church council has been working with Bishop Wickstrom on the Call Process. As you may remember by her last conversation with the congregation in the fall, the Call Process is a very organized and well spelled out process with flow charts and timelines. Our congregation is currently in Phase I (there are four phases) of the process. Phase I starts when the Pastor announces their resignation and ends with Phase IV "Welcoming of a new Pastor."

Pastoral Coverage: Bishop Wickstom is in process of securing an interim pastor for CLC. I have been informed that the interim will most likely be ready to join us sometime at the end of July. Until then the Worship and Music committee and church council are in discussion and preparation for maintaining an active worship and fellowship life here at CLC.

Council and Congregation: Farewell activities for Pastor Randy: Randy's last Sunday worship service will be May 22nd. Special worship music and worship activities will take place at the 11:00 service, followed by a celebration dinner. There will be more about these plans as they develop.




