Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the books I am currently reading is *Christ Plays in Ten Thousand Places* by Eugene Peterson. Early in his book he makes this observation: “Story is the most natural way of enlarging and deepening our sense of reality, and then enlisting us as participants in it. Stories open doors to areas or aspects of life that we didn’t know were there, or had quit noticing out of over-familiarity, or supposed were out-of-bounds to us. They then welcome us in. Stories are verbal acts of hospitality.”

Stories are an important part of our lives. Let me make a suggestion that I have made before about Christmas and our preparations for this time of year: This Christmas why not give yourself this gift. After everyone has gone to bed or before anyone else gets up, find a quiet place and read the Christmas story. Do it for a week. One day read it from Matthew and stop and think about how Joseph must have felt. The next day read it from Luke. How did Mary feel? Go back to Matthew and ask: “How did Mary react to what Joseph wanted to do”? Go back to Luke. How did the shepherds feel as the angels came, as they tried to find the baby in the town, as they saw Jesus in the manger, as they returned to their sheep? Go back to Matthew. What was Herod thinking and feeling? How about the Magi? How do you think God must have felt? How did the angels feel? As you are reading the stories and thinking about what you have read don’t be afraid to read between the lines and to use your imaginations. Listen to what God is trying to say to you. Look at all of the different angles, facets, and stories within the story. What does God want you to know? What is he saying to you?

We have this great story. Read it again and again but take the time to look at it with fresh eyes and ears and hearts. If Christmas has lost its meaning it isn’t because of the store owners, toy manufacturers, television, or Internet – it’s because of us. Somewhere we have lost the story. It has ceased to be ours. Take the time to rediscover and reclaim it.

Perhaps some of you have begun your Christmas shopping or are considering starting soon. As you begin making your plans, please consider the Advent Conspiracy. The story of Christ's birth is a story of promise, hope, and revolutionary love. So what happened? What was once a time to celebrate the birth of a Savior has somehow turned into a season of stress, traffic jams, and shopping lists. And when it is all over, many of us are left with presents to return, looming debt that will take months to pay off, and this empty feeling of missed purpose. What if Christmas were to become a life changing event? Welcome to the Advent Conspiracy.



This year, as in the previous 2 years, we don't want to change the whole world, but we do want to change one village. More than a billion people worldwide lack access to clean water. A woman or child in sub-Saharan Africa will walk an average of 3.7 miles every day to get water, not all of it clean. Helping a community construct and maintain a well opens a world of opportunity. This year we would like to collect enough money to furnish one village with a well and change their world. The cost is \$2,500.
