


# THE NUGGET



# February 2017, from Pastor Dan

Epiphany is a time of the revelation of who this Jesus is, and as we finish up the season of Epiphany in February our main focus is on the teachings in Matthew Chapter 5. In here we find the Beatitudes and the teaching of Jesus that remind us that in God's view of the world, it is often the down and out, the poor, those who are the brunt of jokes and the persecuted that are truly blessed. To twist things even more, the word for "blessed" is the one often used to describe those who are at the top of their game, the ones who are successful and affluent. In the God's eye view of the world, it is the ones who seem to have lost everything the world holds dear, who are open to be filled will all God has to offer. While the prevalence of the prosperity Gospel seems to be on the rise in our world, the antithesis of that comes to us in Matthew as well as the rest of the Gospels. Prosperity is not a sign of God's blessings, but often can become an impediment to them. When our focus is to fill our lives with our stuff, there is simply less focus on receiving that which comes from God. The solution of course is to see that all we have in life, no matter how much or how little, is a gift from God, and it is a gift for a purpose. We are blessed to be a blessing. Ultimately it is not about "me" "an" "God" which always ends up with a vision of a "mean" "God" but rather our calling to learn to live together as the children of God in this world.

On Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, we change focus. This is Ash Wednesday and begins our Lenten journey, where the reflection is more on ourselves and our relationship to God. We will be gathering on Wednesday evenings and worshiping together using the liturgical setting called the Holden Evening Prayer. Even in this Lenten liturgical worship however the focus is to strengthen our spirit for the purpose of reaching out into the world and being the body of Christ alive and active in the world.

And so we continue in our personal lives and in our church year, round and round from action in the world, to reflection and prayer on that action and to the interaction as we gather with one another. It is a journey we make each year in the worship life of the church, and each day in our own worship life. Learning what it means to be a child of God in this world, bringing that word alive in how we act in the world and then reflecting on that alive and active word in our prayer, study and worship.

I look forward to our journeying together through the teaching of, and the reflecting on, the word of God alive and active in our lives and in our world.

In addition, there will also be a number of Lenten devotional materials in the entryway to help you with your prayer and devotional life as you make your Lenten journey this year.


