- 7. We are needing to develop a schedule for the counting of the offering. It needs to be one council member and one other member who is not the council member's family. Council will discuss this at the next meeting.
- 8. Election of new officers: Denise Harro-President, Casey Olson-Vice Prsident, Kate Veh-Secretary.
- 9. Denise shared that the construction project is basically done. Casey and Kathy shared that there are needs for technology and lighting.





HAPPY BIRTHDAY AND ANNIVERSARY! We are collecting items for the Soldotna Community Food Pantry. In a total of 154 boxes were distributed serving 225 adults and 95 children, bringing the third quarter total to 460 boxes serving 805 adults and 356 children. The pantry welcomes more volunteers. Bagging begins Wednesdays at 10:00 AM-2:00 PM and you are welcome to come for an hour or for the afternoon. Volunteers are needed for bagging staple products as well as working with clients. Peanut butter, tuna, cereal, canned fruit, canned entrees like soup, chili, pork and beans, canned and dried beans are always needed. If you are shopping and wish to buy extra food for the pantry, please drop it by the church and we will get it to the pantry. Small bottles of shampoo, bars of soap, tooth paste, etc. are also needed. Of course, money is always appreciated. There is a donation container on the table for your gifts.
