Dear Friends in Christ,

When my grandson Michael was almost 2 years old one of his favorite games was hide and seek. He loved this game and he quickly learned that he had to be very quiet when he played because if he made any noise the person who was it would find him. One day I was watching him and we were sitting on the floor playing dinosaurs. Suddenly he got up to get his car on the other side of the room. He walked over to the car, gave me a look, smiled, and took off like a shot.

Now he was already up and had a head start and I was sitting on the floor. At 50 I didn't move as fast as I once did, so by the time I got up he was gone. I began calling for him, "Michael!" No answer. "Michael!!" Still there is no answer. I listened but the only sound I could hear was the beating of my heart. Where could that little kid have gone so quickly? I began checking all of his favorite places in the lower level of the house. He wasn't there. Quickly I ran up the stairs and began to search room by room, but still no Michael. I checked the front door to make sure it was still locked. It was. He hadn't escaped. My heart slowed a tiny bit but not much. Where could the kid be? The only place I hadn't looked was the laundry room. He certainly wouldn't have gone in there. It was too dark, and besides it was too quiet. I went to the laundry room and flipped on light switch. There he was sitting on the floor in front of the dryer as far back in the room as he could get just as quiet as he could be. When the light came on he squealed with delight, jumped up, ran into my arms, gave me a big hug and a kiss and said, "hide and seek?" ready to do it all over again.

When we think of hide and seek we usually think of it as a child's game, yet as adults we often spend a lot of time playing it as well. While there are times we seek God, there are also times we try to hide from him.

Even though we know it is impossible, we try. The author of Hebrew says, "For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints, and marrow, it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is laid bare." In other words, God cuts to the chase, penetrates all of our pretenses and goes straight to our hearts and souls and sees us for who we truly are. He even sees into that "secret self" we pray no one ever will discover. And the amazing thing is that even after he has seen everything about us he loves us. We often look at that stuff as those things that make us unlovable, sometimes even to ourselves. God looks at all that stuff and says, "It's all right. I understand. Remember I'm the one who created you. I never said I would always approve of everything you said, or did or thought, but what I want you to know is you are mine and I love you just the way you are right now."

Those are important words to hear. They're words I need to hear for there are times I am like my grandson Michael hiding in the dark, sitting as quietly as I can, hoping no one will see yet at the same time praying God will find me. Suddenly the light comes on and I jump up with joy because I have been found, and I feel the arms of God around me.


