"This is true. We are all beggars." As we move on to Reformation Sunday and beyond, let us start with the final words of Martin Luther. The hallmark of the Reformation is the emphasis that we are saved by the grace of a loving God. Throughout history, humanity has tried to put qualifiers on that simple concept. We are saved by grace and all we have to do is.... and then the list go on and on. Taken to the extreme, salvation by grace calls us to see all those around us as brothers and sisters in the family of God. The little adorable child sitting in the same pew in church as well as the ISIS extremist who just brutally murdered someone because of their misguided view of what God wants in this world. I must say that Grace, pure grace, is uncomfortable for me. But then I remember that I claim that same grace for myself. ADVENT CONSPIRACY

Perhaps some of you have begun your Christmas shopping or are considering starting soon. As you begin making your plans, please consider the Advent Conspiracy. The story of Christ's birth is a story of promise, hope, and revolutionary love. So what happened? What was once a time to celebrate the birth of a Savior has somehow turned into a season of stress, traffic jams, and shopping lists. And when it is all over, many of us are left with presents to return, looming debt that will take months to pay off, and this empty feeling of missed purpose. What if Christmas were to become a life changing event? Welcome to the Advent Conspiracy. This year, as in the previous three years, we don't want to change the whole world, but we do want to change one village. More than a billion people worldwide lack access to clean water. A woman or child in sub-Saharan Africa will walk an average of 3.7 miles every day to get water, not all of it clean. Helping a community construct and maintain a well opens a world of opportunity. This year we would like to collect enough money to furnish one village with a well and change their world. The cost is \$2,500. If you want to see what difference a well can make in the life of a village and what some of the conditions are in sub-Saharan Africa read *Along Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park. It is a quick read, but one certainly that will touch your heart. There are also copies of The Advent Conspiracy in the entryway. Take one, read it, share it, and try some of the ideas to make your Advent and Christmas more meaningful.


