The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

These words, known as the Apostolic Greeting, come from the apostle Paul's letter to the community of Corinth, quoted in 2 Corinthians 13:13. This is a classic greeting that Paul uses when he addresses the communities he's writing to, naming the Triune God—Savior, Creator and Sanctifier. We quote Paul during our worship service every week, because these words are still pertinent in 2017.

I love using Paul's greeting because it's not one-sided. Yes, as the pastor, I promise that my work here among you will be to preach and teach, to preside over the sacraments, and to lead and guide this congregation to seek God in our lives. I said I would do these things with the help of God during my installation on October 8th. I stood in front of you, behind you, beside you, as Bishop Shelley and I moved about the sanctuary to make these promises at the different spots that mark the unique places of pastoral ministry.

Truthfully, my favorite part of the installation is the same as my favorite part of the Apostolic Greeting, which is the mutuality. On the morning of October 8th, many of you congratulated me as if it were my success or accomplishment. To which I'd respond, "And congratulations to you!" Perhaps my inner-Paul was fighting to get out, but the installation was and is about our shared relationship together. While I have the more churchy words during the greeting, you all respond with powerful words: "And also with you." We greet each other, both speaking, as a sign of our journey together as the church. In fact, some say that this Apostolic Greeting each week is a renewal of the call to be your pastor and for you to be my congregation. This greeting weekly is, in a sense, a mini-installation. It's a reminder that we are in it together.

With the excitement of finishing the call process for your new pastor and the fanfare of the installation behind us, it's time to settle into our work together. While we're still in the honeymoon stage of getting to know each other, there will come a day when I will disappoint you. I will be too bold or not bold enough in a sermon. I will forget an appointment. I will overbook myself. I won't remember to tell you something important. I'll leave the church mail in my car. I won't be what you want me to be, in the moment you want me to be it, at some point in the years ahead. Similarly, you will let me down too. And that's okay. Because we made the promise to each other in my installation that we would try, with God's help, to support one another. We'll need to remember to be gracious with the other and to think of the other in the best possible light. And when I do let you down, come talk to me. My door is always open, even if it's physically shut because I get distracted by how many awesome things are happening in the church building during the week. Call me. Text me. Invite me for coffee or to see your kids in an activity or to take me on your fishing boat. I want to know you and I want you to know me, because we are in it together. May God be with you this day.

OLD BUSINESS

- Technology Update: Kathy is working with Signupgenius and will try it for other needs.
- Homeless: Mo Sanders will be the organizational person for CLC homeless hosting project if or whenever that happens, which may be through the community project called Family Promise.
 Pastor Meredith said there's a screening process for people to be housed, as well as structure through the Family Promise umbrella.
- Youth Ministry: Thanks to Katie Olson for everything she's done.
- Credit Card: Joyce and Pastor Meredith will both have church credit cards, with a combined total of \$2,500 collateral (maximum on the account). This can be changed, if the need arises.
- Lutefisk Dinner: There will be the dinner on November 11th. The money raised will go to the youth program. It will be donation only & not a charged fee (this will prevent DEC interference).
- Church Council: We need to remember to post pictures and names on the bulletin board, but we'll wait for new members first.
- Outreach: \$1,210 was given from our members that will be sent to the Lutheran Disaster Hurricane Response. A motion was made that we give \$1,000 to the hurricane relief now and if there's another project for Eben-Ezer down the road, we can help them at that time. The motion passed.

- **Kitchen Rules & Regulations** (safe food handling): There's a binder in kitchen with posters from DEC, thanks to Kathy.
- **Kitchen Purchasing**: After many years, Rochelle Schneider decided to retire from purchasing and stocking hospitality supplies. We are looking for someone to carry this on.
- College Boxes: Gwen Johnson will lead the college care box collection and distribution again this year.
- Annual Meeting: November 5th. Up to three new members can serve, with at least one being a confirmed youth member.
- Transportation Outreach: We will provide Pastor Meredith \$250 worth of cab tokens to help someone in need find transportation, if necessary.
- First Aid: We need to purchase first aid kits and an AED to make the building safer for all.
- Building Use Policy: We're working to establish building use policies, especially for all visiting groups.
- Job Descriptions: Pastor Meredith would like to get formal job descriptions and expectations on file for Joyce, Lisa, and Sue. We need to include the treasurer in this as well. The Council advised that we have people write up their own job descriptions. Council also said that there should be a progressive disciplinary system, in case if there's a concern on both sides of a job issue, there should be a way to handle that.
- Maintenance Items: Kathy has a log. The CO2 and smoke alarms need to be upgraded. The kitchen sink has been replaced.

The women will meet November 7th at 10:00 AM in the senior high room to discuss GRATITUDE. Potluck lunch to follow.


