

Dear Friends in Christ,

Over the years I have collected a lot of stories. Some of them I have found and others people have sent to me because they think I will like them or might be able to use them at some time. I'm not really sure where this story came from and I guess it doesn't really matter but I thought I would share it with you:

Mom's Empty Chair

A woman's daughter had asked the local minister to come and pray with her mother. When the minister arrived, he found the woman lying in bed with her head propped up on two pillows. An empty chair sat beside her bed. The minister assumed that the woman had been informed of his visit. "I guess you were expecting me," he said. "No, who are you?" said the mother. The minister told her his name and then remarked, "I saw the empty chair and I figured you knew I was going to show up." "Oh yeah, the chair," said the bedridden woman. "Would you mind closing the door?" Puzzled, the minister shut the door. "I have never told anyone this, not even my daughter," said the woman. "But all of my life I have never known how to pray. At church I used to hear the pastor talk about prayer, but it went right over my head and I abandoned any attempt at prayer," the old woman continued, "until one day four years ago, my best friend said to me, 'Prayer is just a simple matter of having a conversation with Jesus. Here is what I suggest: Sit down in a chair; place an empty chair in front of you, and in faith see Jesus on the chair. It's not spooky because he promised I will be with you always. Then just speak to him in the same way you're doing with me right now.' So, I tried it and I've liked it so much that I do it a couple of hours every day. I'm careful though. If my daughter saw me talking to an empty chair, she'd either have a nervous breakdown or send me off to the funny farm." The minister was deeply moved by the story and encouraged the old woman to continue on the journey. Then he prayed with her and returned to the church. Two nights later the daughter called to tell the minister that her mother had died that afternoon. "Did she die in peace?" he asked. "Yes, when I left the house about two o'clock, she called me over to her bedside, told me she loved me and kissed me on the cheek. When I got back from the store an hour later, I found her. But there was something strange about her death. Apparently, just before Mom died, she leaned over and rested her head on the chair beside the bed. What do you make of that?" The minister wiped a tear from his eye and said, 'I wish we could all go like that.'

There are all kinds of books on prayer and prayer practices and they all have something they can teach us about prayer; however, when it comes right down to it it's simply a matter to talking to your best friend. How you do that or how you picture that isn't important. The important thing is simply to do it.

COUNCIL MINUTES - August 11, 2014

Old Business:

Church website will now work on mobile devices.

Church sign: Jon L. spoke with Guff Sherman about the sign. Jon suggested a 4 x 8 sign and Guff said that it would start at about \$1250 for a double plywood and \$200 more for baked aluminum. Guff suggested that the aluminum would be best since it would last longer. Jon also called another company that specializes in church signs. Jon will check with city about current zoning laws concerning signs.

Keith thought that we should combine various work projects around the church with the sign and make a committee that could focus on getting those things done.

The new office computer is here but the old church membership program will not function with Windows 7.

Motion passed to purchase new membership software.

God's Work Our Hands: Mark shared ideas for projects that he found on the web. Mark met with Twyla and discussed the project. Mark ordered God's Work, Our Hands T-shirts. Keith will check with ACC about an idea. Mark will work with Twyla and others and look into other opportunities.

New Business:

Emergency preparedness: Given the recent fire, how are we going to respond as a church to future events?

We will look at updating emergency phone tree list and contacting local agencies to let them know we are available to help.

Annual Meeting: Requirements for the meeting were reviewed. We need to set the date and time for the meeting.

Carpet needs to be cleaned. The entryway would be priority followed by the fellowship hall and the sanctuary. Randy received an email from the Bishop letting us know that the MV Christian is no longer up and running and inquiring as to whether our church would still want to support LAMP (now named LIM-Lutheran Indian Ministries). Keith suggested that we continue the support. Everyone agreed.

VBS-Randy, Ted, and Mark noted that it was very successful and fun. Plans are already being made for next year.

Online Charitable contributions: Cheryl shared some ways that the church could possibly receive donations from Fred Meyer, Safeway, and Amazon. Randy will look into the requirements for enrolling into the programs.

Comfort for: the children around the world who are in orphanages.




FAMILY PHOTO BOARD

The Pantry is a joint project of Soldotna United Methodist Church and Christ Lutheran Church. Additional support comes from generous individuals, organizations, local businesses, as well as help from the Peninsula Food Bank.



The Pantry is open Wednesdays from 11:00 AM – 2:00 PM. In July a total of 99 boxes were distributed serving 169 adult and 82 children. Volunteers are always needed. Bagging starts at 10:00 AM and you are welcome to come for an hour or for the afternoon. Peanut butter, cereal, canned fruit, canned entrees like chili, ravioli, pork and beans, etc. are always needed. If you are shopping and wish to buy extra food for the pantry, please drop it by the church and we will get it to the pantry.
